



Wraparound for Providers AT A GLANCE

What is Wraparound?

Wraparound is a structured fidelity-based care planning process and part of the Youth Empowerment Services (YES) system of care in Idaho. Wraparound is intended to assist you the families who may be experiencing high levels of need or are at risk of more intensive services, including out of home placement.

Wraparound is a team-based, family-driven, and youth guided care planning process that is driven by a set of guiding principles.

- Family-driven and youth guided
- Team-based
- Individualized
- Community-based
- Strenth-based
- Culturally & linguistically responsive
- Persistence
- Natural and Community Supports
- Collaboration

Using these principles, a Wraparound Coordinator provides a structured care planning process that supports a youth and family's vision and desired outcomes. This process is accomplished by utilizing and building on existing strengths to target identified needs that are specific to the youth and family. Wraparound coordinators, in coordination with the youth and family, build a child and family team (CFT) that is comprised of formal and informal supports to develop on cross-sytem plan of care.

In Idaho, Wraparound provided by the Division of Behavioral Health for all youth is call Idaho WInS, **W**raparound **I**ntensive **S**ervices.

How does Wraparound Impact My Work as a Provider?

As an Optum Network provider, you may be asked by a Wraparound Coordinator to be part of a Wraparound team or CFT at the request of the youth and family.

If you are invited to participate in a Wraparound care planning process, a youth under your care has asked for your participation in their Wraparound team. Your time spent participating in the Wraparound teaming process is reimbursable using the CFT billing code (G9007). If you have questions about billing, please contact Optum Idaho at 855-202-0983, Option 3.

The Wraparound Coordinator will communicate with you to discuss your role in the youth and family's life, identify ways in which you can participate in the Wraparound care planning process, and how Wraparound can support your goals as an Optum Network provider.



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Wraparound may seem like other care planning processes in the YES system of care, such as Targeted Care Coordination (TCC). Each type of care coordination has its own unique strengths to support youth and families. If a youth has TCC and requires a more intense level of care coordination like Wraparound, the TCC provider and Wraparound coordinator collaborate with the family to ensure an effective transition from TCC to Wraparound. Given that a youth and family can only do one care planning

process at a time, Wraparound may be the best fit for a youth with severe needs.

Wraparound eligibility requires youth to have:

- A need for intensive care coordination or have not experienced improvements with current care coordination activities.
- An overall CANS level of a three.
- Involvement in multiple systems.
- A desire, along with their family, for the Wraparound care planning process as Wraparound is voluntary.
- A need for a higher level of care such as partial hospitalization, hospitalization, residential care, or the youth needs to be returning from a higher level of care to the community of their choice.
