# Save the Date: NW TCOM Conference comes to Boise in May

Idaho has adopted TCOM, or Transformational Collaborative Outcomes Management, to help guide the implementation of the Youth Empowerment Services children's mental health program.

Transformational Collaborative Outcomes Management is a shared-vision philosophy to help people achieve wellness as they navigate various child-serving systems. One of the most well-known TCOM tools, the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS), is now used in Idaho to support decision making, help with quality improvement and monitor service outcomes. Learn more about TCOM on the Praed Foundation website, and attend a TCOM conference in Boise to learn and connect with others.



The Department of Health and Welfare's Divisions of Behavioral Health, Medicaid, and Family and Community Services are partnering with the State Department of Education, Department of Juvenile Corrections and the Praed Foundation to host this two-day event.



The conference theme is "Setting the Stage: Creating a Shared Vision to Support Transformation." Attendees will have an opportunity to learn from others' experiences and collaborate on how to best meet the needs of children and families served, as well as hear the stories of individuals from across multiple systems.

A one-page handout provides an introduction to Wrparound so families can learn about this planning process to help them decide if they think it is right for their child and family. Wraparound is a team-based, family-driven and youth-guided planning process used in the YES system of care in Idaho. Wraparound is intended to assist youth and families who may be experiencing a high level of needs. *Wraparound at a Glance* is available in English and Spanish.
