All report contents are from approved IGT meeting minutes and incorporates recommendations/feedback from the subcommittees to IGT. A draft will be sent to the IGT Executive Committee for review in the next two weeks and then to IGT by February 9, 2024, for their review. Megan Schuelke also shared that she is continuing to reach out to youth and tribal members for participation in the IGT meeting.

They are also working with Optum until the Magellan start date.</li> <li>It was noted that Optum's motion for an injunction to prevent moving forward with the Magellan contract was dismissed; however, it is anticipated that Optum and Beacon will both appeal that decision.</li> <li>Negotiations between the State and Optum to extend the contract past February and to increase rates during that time frame are still occurring. This rate increase could result in a budget shortfall and that would have to be worked through. 				In the chat, Brittany Shipley shared that it is even rare to identify	
				PRTF's that will accept youth under 12 as it is considered a specialty	
				population, very few that Idaho currently contracts with accept youth that young, I believe, and I could be wrong, but I believe only	
				2 accept youth under 12 that Idaho has current contracts with for	
				under the age of 12 or 10. In the chat, Val Johnson explained that it	
				is ages 12 through 18 for the first year with them expected to	



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				develop a plan for youth 5 and up. Some facilities are already moving this way. Brook Heath added that as of right now, the Crisis	
				Centers take 12 and up to 17. However, we are working with them	
				to plan for younger. Some of them have been able to have younger	
				ones there.	
				Jessica Barawed shared in the chat that youth often enter into the Juvenile Justice system with high behavioral health needs. High behavioral health needs that have not been addressed often lead youth to intersect with the Juvenile Justice system based on an escalation of behaviors, which makes it even more difficult to access services. Kim Hokanson noted that she agrees with the comment of intersection and she is hopeful with Juvenile Justice's initiatives and DHW's that children are not finding themselves in Corrections and/or custody due to high behavioral health needs. IGT members asked what the capacity is for MST providers. DHW explained that it depends on how many providers the facility has. The general range is 5 to 6 families per provider. It was clarified that the contract does not limit the number of families that a	
				provider can have.	
				IGT members asked how the Residential Treatment Centers are funded. Medicaid members shared that Medicaid can reimburse for some services. It depends on the medical necessity as well. The Division of Family and Community Services (FACS) and the Division of Behavioral Health (DBH) can also pay for this. The State also shared that the Treatment and Foster Care contract amendment is in progress.	
				Members asked about the PRTF timeline and DHW shared that there are several steps to get through to be able to bill Medicaid. Each facility is going through those steps and it is hoped that these will happen within the next few months. DBH continues to work with families in ensuring these children are getting the services they need.
