Specific dates remain TBD based on resource allocation.</p> <p><b>1/21/26, In Progress.</b> The IAP deliverable updates will be included in DHW implementation updates. The DD/SED Juvenile Justice workgroup has been paused to prioritize the IWG’s work on Jeff D IAP Objective B.3.e. ii. A formal notice of this pause was sent to stakeholders on December 4, 2025. CMH is currently coordinating a follow-up meeting with stakeholders to ensure these populations (DD/SED youth and SED/complex youth) served in Juvenile Detention Centers and youth served in IDJC custody are accurately represented in the IAP deliverable. While a Doodle poll was provided, CMH is working through persistent scheduling conflicts to ensure this conversation occurs. Stakeholders will be re-engaged through IGT subcommittees once the second phase of the IAP deliverable occurs.
